The majority of our programming takes place outside, rain or shine. Please ensure that your camper's clothing is up to the demands of the outdoors.

Laundry facilities will be made available for two- and four-week campers.

Clothing:

- Shorts
- Long pants (not jeans)
- T-shirts
- Long sleeved shirt
- Underwear
- Rain gear
- Socks
- Swim wear (girls are advised to bring a sport suit or one piece; avoid ties, clasps and clips)
- Shoes
- Hiking boots
- Jacket
- Sweater
- Pajamas
- Hat (wide brim preferred)












Equipment:

- Sleeping bag
- Sheets and blankets (optional)
- Flash light
- Sunscreen (minimum SPF 30)
- Insect repellent (non-aerosol)
- Toiletries (toothbrush and toothpaste, soap, shampoo, facecloth, deodorant, sanitary needs, towel)

Optional Items:

- Backpack / Daypack
- Water shoes
- UVA/UVB sunglasses
- Disposable or inexpensive camera with film
- Pre-addressed envelopes with stamps
- Pen, pencil, and writing paper
- Cards
- Camp-friendly musical instruments
- Laundry soap and dryer sheets

Do Not Bring:

-  Cell phones
-  Expensive clothing
-  DVD players
-  Computers
-  Expensive jewelry
-  Walkie Talkie radios
-  Electronic games (PSP, GameBoy, Game Gear)
-  Appliances (hair dryers / straightners)
-  Valuable items
-  Food
-  Perfume / Cologne

Keep in Mind:

- Wool and synthetic fabrics stay warm when wet. Cotton does not.
- Daypacks can make life at camp a whole lot easier! They save things from getting lost or forgotten during a very busy day.
- Please leave your snacks at home. They may pose a health risk to another camper or attract wildlife.
